III. Executive Director's Report

The ILCC totaled \$555,260 in revenue for the month of August, a 64% decrease from August in 2021 and 49% decrease from July 2022 due to the 1A (retail license) fee waiver.

Revenues received will consist primarily of special event license fees, new licenses, and enforcement activities.

Five (5) liquor control trainee positions are still under review with the CMS and the para-legal posting is still live.

The interviews for the open accounting positions have been completed and the new employee has accepted the offer of employment.

Currently we have three (3) underage compliance assistance and a 4th pending a background check. We continue to recruit under the new streamlined hiring process.

A new I.T. manager has been identified and is awaiting the results of their background check prior to beginning employment.

We currently have 31,304 active licenses and Licensing has issued 3,031 new licenses have been issued in August of 2022.

The ILCC has seen a 30% increase in special event permits issued from July of 2022.

IT is continuing to work on the online payment option for fines.

Industry Education

The ILCC Industry Education Division, along with Enforcement, and the Executive Director attended the ILBA Convention, gave a presentation and answered questions from people in attendance.

BASSET also had a booth at the convention. We have trained 6.046 in the month of August.

The Executive Director attended the Center for Alcohol Conference for information regarding current and upcoming trends and issues impacting the alcohol industry.

Our social media reach is steadily increasing.

Our College Town Summit will take place on November 9th and will be virtual.

The ILCC Podcast is ready and available for listening on Spotify.

Q3 Newsletter will be published next month.

Legal

Legal attended the National Conference for State Liquor Administrators – West and Central Conference, where they sat on a panel.

The ILCC has 35 cases pending. 6 distributor cases, 33 retail cases, 4 sale of alcohol to minor cases, and legal closed 61 cases that were assigned to them.

22 Pre-Disciplinary Conferences and 13 were conducted in August. In addition, 4 sales of alcohol to minor cases were conducted: two (2) were first time offenses and two (2) were second-time offenses.

There are currently 16 Appeals open with the ILCC, not including those that are in Administrative Review, which are being worked on with the Attorney General's Office.

27 FOIA requests were received by the legal division.

Enforcement

Enforcement conducted 671 inspections and discovered 300 violations in August and issued 61 Pre-Licensing Inspections.

Common violations were: Personnel not being BASSET certified, pregnancy warning signs not being displayed, State license not being displayed, and Illinois Sales Tax certificate not being available.

We are not including an Inspection Check list for all new licensees to help individuals pass prelicensing inspections.

The ILCC received 94 complaints via the online complaint form and through other means of communications. The most common complaints were: Sale of Alcohol to a Minor, Operating without a Valid License, and retail-to-retail purchase of alcohol.

Enforcement conducted an Underage Compliance Check with the Guardian Park Police Department. 14 establishments were checked and 4 failed the inspection.

V. Partner Presentations

Sandra Oviedo and Ama Diaz de Leon from the Pilsen Wellness Center presented information regarding their organization, its services, and the efforts they are making in relation to deterring and counseling individuals who deal with alcohol substance abuse.

VII. Child Support Cases

The Commission heard testimony in relation to *The Dopest LLC (Brandon Shrome)* 22-CS-01 related to 30 day delinquency on child support payments.

Counsel Zisook indicated that the Department of Healthcare and Family Services confirmed they are comfortable with a continuance of 30-days to allow the respondent to settle-up the outstanding payments.

Commissioner Powell made the motion to allow for a continuance until the next Commission meeting, the meeting was seconded by Commissioner Sullivan.
