III. Executive Director's Report

Licensing

- Active licenses -31,093
 - o 2.473 Issued
 - o 202 new licenses
- Special events
 - o In November, 155 Special Event licenses were issued. 93% submitted their applications electronically.
 - o 4,133 special event licenses issued YTD.
 - We are happy that so many of our licensees are utilizing their MyTax Illinois account to apply for their special event licenses, as this helps expedite the review and processing of their requests.
- ILCC continues to work on regression testing for the upcoming Service Pack Upgrade being implemented this month. This new upgrade impacts the 3 agencies that currently utilizes Gentax/MyTaxlllinios: JOOR, ILCC, IDES. We have had to allocate time and resources for regression testing and the upgrade impacts the management payments systems and voucher processing.

- We are continuing our commitment to reducing youth access to alcoholic beverages
 - By use of Underage Compliance Checks.
 - Happy to report that the new UAC Asst program is growing, we currently have 50 active underage participants.
 - 14 UAC details

- 211 establishments
 - o 158 compliant
 - o 53 failed
 - 30 prior offenders re-checked.
 - 5 repeat offenders failed again,
- Enforcement also continues to concentrate on cases involving the sale & delivery of alcohol via the online marketplace. These are problematic for many reasons including but not limited to these illegal sales not having proper safeguards to prevent selling to minors.

- We are also actively working on procuring a body camera solution for enforcement to comply with the statutory mandate which goes into effect in 2025.
