III. Executive Director's Report

• Job Position

- o 3 new enforcement supervisors begin at the beginning of this month.
 - Supervisor for the Chicago central region
 - Northern region
 - Southern region
- o Licensing supervisor vacancy was posted in the month of January.
 - Currently in the grading process to determine which candidates will be invited to sit for an interview.

• Fiscal

- o Fiscal Year 2025 Total Revenue \$11.3 Million
 - 12% increase from FY24
 - 6% increase from FY19
- O Dram Shop Fund \$19.3 Million (4.8% decrease from beginning balance)
- January Revenue \$2.1 Million
 - o Liquor Licenses generated approximately \$1.1 Million.
 - o Fines/Penalties or Violations generated approximately \$145,00.

<u>Licensing</u>

- o December 2025 Figures
 - Active licenses 31,092
 - 2,693 issued.
 - 227 new licenses were issued.
 - 97% of licensees renewed online.
 - Special event licenses
 - 178
 - 85% of the special event licenses were submitted online.

 - There were 11 Bona-Fide disputes filed for the month.

 - Total of 740 Inspections.
 - 96 were First Inspections.
 - 232 violations were cited.

 - o Personnel not BASSET certified.
 - o IL Sales Tax certificate unavailable
 - Contaminated Liquor
 - o Pre-mix not destroyed weekly.
 - 107 warnings were issued.
 - Most common
 - Pregnancy Sign not displayed.
 - IL Sales Tax certificate unavailable
 - Taps not cleaned pursuant to ILCC Rule
 - Tap cleaning record not kept.

- Personnel not Basset certified.
- 6 Pre-licensing site inspections
- Complaints
 - The ILCC received 28 complaints in January. The complaints came via the online submission form, email, phone calls, and in-person information.
 - The most common complaints were No valid License, Not Basset certified, the sale of alcohol to a minor, and Happy hour violation(s)
 - Enforcement investigated and closed 10 complaints.
- Underage Compliance Details totals for January.
 - 11 Underage Compliance missions
 - 166 establishments were checked.
 - 40 failures
 - 126 were compliant.
 - 30 prior offenders were retested for compliance.
 - 5 of the prior offenders checked failed compliance.
 - Total of 53 participants are currently active and working on the Underage Compliance missions.
- Online marketplace sales
 - o Removed from marketplace:
 - 23 posts from Craigslist
 - 5 posts from Facebook Marketplace
 - 2 posts from Offer-Up
