

BASSET Requirements

BASSET cards are valid for 3 years in Illinois. If you are a server, seller, bartender or security personnel, you are required by law to be BASSET certified in order to work in any establishment that sells or servers alcohol.

DONT FORGET TO CHECK YOUR BASSET CARD EXPIRATION DATE.

Q: Do I have to renew my BASSET card?

A: Yes. Your BASSET card is valid for 3 years from the date you took the class. You must take the BASSET class every three years to stay compliant.

Is Your BASSET Card Current?

Uncertified BASSET staff is one of the top five compliance violations the ILCC Enforcement Division finds when inspecting liquor licensed establishments. In the State of Illinois, every seller, server, bartender of open alcoholic beverages and cocktail delivery and security personnel must be BASSET certified. Furthermore, local laws may require additional BASSET certifications. So, why are licensees still getting this \$100 fine? Your guess is as good as ours. BASSET has been mandatory since 2018 in Illinois. We have well over 100 trainers that provide in-person and online training. In order to help avoid this unnecessary fine, we will continue sending out a monthly expiration reminder. The ILCC will resume in-person BASSET training this year in our Chicago and Springfield offices. The spots are limited so subscribe on our website so you get the "Register Now" email.



Who Must Be BASSET Certified

- Managers
- Bartenders
- Sellers
- Servers (Not-for-Profit Special Event servers are not required to be BASSET certified. Special Use servers are.)
- Security

Quick Tips

- You have 120 days from your hire date to obtain your certification.
- BASSET certification is valid for 3 years after issuance.
- You can search for your BASSET ID # online.
- It may take up to 30 45 days for your BASSET card to be available online.
- If you need to update your information, you must reach out to your trainer to make the required changes.

Would You Drink It? If Not, Why Serve It?



During every inspection, one of the key focus areas is the condition of taps and hoses. ILCC Enforcement agents review many items, but you might be surprised at what they often find when checking taps and hoses. To remain compliant, licensees must clean their taps and hoses regularly to prevent the buildup of bacteria, mold, and other microorganisms that can grow inside them.

Dirty Taps Can Cause a Lot of Health Risks:

Bacterial Growth

Dirty taps can harbor harmful bacteria such as E. coli, Salmonella, and Listeria, which may contaminate beverages and cause foodborne illness.

Mold and Yeast Contamination

Beer lines and taps that aren't cleaned regularly often develop mold and wild yeast, which can cause off-flavors and health concerns for consumers with sensitivities.

Biofilm Formation

A sticky layer of microorganisms (biofilm) builds up inside unclean taps and lines. This biofilm is resistant to normal rinsing and can continually contaminate drinks.

The Importance of Sanitation

Since we are on the subject of cleanliness, Did you know that fruit flies thrive in environments with presence of fermenting fruits, vegetables, or other organic matter.

Prevention Checklist:

- · Clean spills immediately
- Store produce properly
- Empty bins regularly
- · Clean drains frequently
- Rinse recyclables
- · Keep cleaning tools dry
- Inspect deliveries closely


New Cease And Desist Notice

Starting December 1, 2025, establishments found to be operating without a license, may be subject to receive a cease and desist notice at their location until the matter is resolved.

Accordingly, you are hereby ordered pursuant to 235 ILCS 5/3-12(a)(5.1) and 235 ILCS 5/10-1(a) to Cease and Desist from engaging in the sale of alcoholic liquors without a valid license. Failure to comply with this notice to Cease and Desist may subject you to civil penalties including a \$20,000 fine or criminal penalties including a Class 4 felony.

Tips On Best Practices

Has your establishment created House Rules, and are they clearly visible to everyone? If not, now is the time to develop them. House Rules help ensure consistency for both staff and customers, making it easier to resolve common issues fairly and effectively in establishments where alcohol is served. If you need support, we have a sample House Rule you can use as a reference.

WELCOME TO [YOUR BAR NAME]

We want everyone to have a safe and enjoyable time. Please respect our House Rules:

- Valid ID Required
 We card everyone, no exceptions.
- **Drink Responsibly**If you appear intoxicated, we cannot serve you.
- Respect Others
 No harassment, fighting, or disruptive behavior.
- No Outside Alcohol or Drugs
 Please keep it safe and clean.
- Be Kind to Staff
 Zero tolerance for abusive or discriminatory language.
- Management Reserves the Right to Refuse Service Safety comes first.

- No drinking while working.
- Always Check IDs Properly.
- No Service to Intoxicated Guests
- Politely refuse service when necessary.
- Alert a manager or security if the patron becomes disruptive.

- No Tolerance for Harassment or Abuse.
- Practice Safe Handling of Alcohol
 & Equipment.

What You Need To Know About Shipping Alcohol

What's Legal:

An out-of-state manufacturer or importer, with an Illinois license, may ship to an importing distributor.

An out-of-state manufacturer with limited selfdistribution privileges and an Illinois license from the ILCC may ship to an Illinois licensed store.

An out-of-state winery, with a winery shipper's license from the ILCC, may ship up to twelve cases of wine per year to an Illinois resident who is aged 21 and older.

Wine may be purchased from and shipped by a licensed manufacturer or importing distributor to an authorized representative of any church or bona fide religious organization for sacramental purposes.

Military members or Illinois residents, living outside of the United States for more than one year, may ship alcohol into Illinois with permission from the ILCC pursuant to Ill. Admin. Code Title 11, Section 100.480(b).

An individual may bring in less than one gallon of alcohol per year, if that individual carries it into Illinois themselves.

Please Note:

Unless the law or the Illinois Liquor Control Commission (ILCC) says it's okay, it is ILLEGAL to ship or bring alcohol into Illinois from another state.



What You Need To Know About Shipping Alcohol (cont'd)

What's Illegal:

Ordering wine online from an out-of-state winery without an ILCC issued Winery Shipper's license, including wine-based products.

Ordering beer from any out-of-state brewery, including malt-based products.

Ordering spirits from any out-of-state distillery, including spirits-based products.

Ordering alcohol from any out-of-state retailers.

Purchasing alcohol in another state and shipping it to someone in Illinois, even if the purchaser assumes the risk.

The ILCC may take the following actions to prevent illegal shipments:

Coordinate with shipping companies to identify illegal shipments of alcohol into Illinois.

Order businesses to cease and desist from making illegal shipments.

Pursue civil penalties and possible criminal charges against businesses that illegally ship alcohol into Illinois.

Initiate disciplinary proceedings against Illinois licensees who ship alcohol into Illinois when not authorized by their license type.



Please Note:

Importantly, it is not legal to ship alcoholic beverages by way of an sale internet which in purchaser (Illinois resident) takes ownership of the beverages in another state, before they are shipped. Unlicensed alcoholic beverage shipments from other states remain illegal under all Illinois circumstances. The Liquor Control Commission will take every measure necessary to illegal shipments prevent alcoholic beverages including issuing cease and desist orders, opening civil enforcement cases, seeking injunctions against the shipper, and, in some cases, referring the matter for criminal prosecution of a felony.


